The Silver Line Helpline, a national charity launched in November 2013, provides the following functions to support older people:

- A sign-posting service to link them into the many services that exist around the country
- A befriending service to combat loneliness
- A means of empowering those who may be suffering abuse and neglect to connect with specialist services to protect them from harm

The Silver Line Helpline, manned by a specially trained team has, since its launch, received over 1.7 million calls. Over two-thirds of these calls are made overnight or at weekends when no other helpline is available for older people who may be lonely, isolated or confused. It is the only confidential, free helpline for older people, across the UK, open every day and night of the year.

They now receive around 10,000 calls every week from the elderly, 90% of who live alone. Over half of all callers say they have literally no-one else to speak to, sometimes for days or weeks and 80% of these are phoning for the first time. Demand for the service keeps rising, with December 2017 the busiest month ever with 47,000 calls.

In addition to the helpline the charity runs a range of friendship services via its army of some 4,000 Silver Line Friend volunteers. These include Telephone Friends who make regular weekly outbound telephone calls and Letters Friends exchanging correspondence with older people who prefer the written word or are hearing impaired. Meanwhile Silver Circles are group calls for people with shared interests akin to a virtual coffee morning. The new Silver Connects service offers more proactive support to people who may struggle to connect with local organisations or activities which the helpline has signposted them to.

There is no age limit, callers are free to express their feelings and can trust the Friends to respect their privacy. In cases of abuse or neglect, with the caller's permission, they will involve specialist organisations such as Action on Elder Abuse, Social Services or the Police as necessary.

The Silver Line Charity rely entirely on voluntary donations, their costs continue to rise due to increased demand requiring them to raise over £15,000 per day just to keep running

Victoria Sandwich Cake

175g soft margarine
175g caster sugar
175g S.R. flour
3 eggs
2-3 tablespoons raspberry jam
2 tins 18cm diameter
Oven: Gas mark 4/350F/180C

Grease and lightly flour the tins. Cream the margarine and sugar until soft and fluffy. In a separate basin beat the eggs lightly and add to the creamed mixture beating thoroughly. Fold in the sieved flour carefully with a metal spoon. Place the mixture equally in the two tins. Bake for 25/30 minutes or until firm and golden brown. When cold, join the cakes together with the jam. Sprinkle the surface lightly with caster sugar.

Lemon Drizzle Cake - Makes a 450g cake

115g butter
175g self-raising flour
175g caster sugar
2 eggs
60ml (4tbs) milk
Rind and juice of 1 lemon
Icing sugar
Granulated sugar

1. Preheat the oven to Gas mark 4/350F/180C/. Grease and line a 450g loaf tin with greaseproof paper. Beat together 115g butter, 175g self-raising flour, 175g caster sugar, 2 eggs, 60ml (4tbsp) milk and the rind of 1 lemon for 2 minutes. Spoon into loaf tin, make a well in the centre and bake for 1 hour until well risen and golden.
2. Loosen edges of cake from tin. Mix juice of 1 lemon and 45 ml (3tbsp) icing sugar together and spoon over the hot cake. Sprinkle with granulated sugar to give a crunchy topping.
3. Leave in tin until cold and then remove greaseproof paper.

Honey Cake

250g of clear honey plus 3 tbsp. to glaze
225g butter, cubed
110g dark muscovado sugar
3 large eggs beaten
300g self-raising flour.

1. Preheat the oven to Gas mark 3/300F/150C
2. Grease and line a 20cm round, loose bottomed cake tin. Put the honey, butter and sugar into a saucepan. Stir over a low heat until melted then increase the heat and boil for 1 minute. Leave to cool for 15 – 20 minutes so that the eggs won't cook when they are added.
3. Beat the eggs into the honey mixture using a wooden spoon. Sift the flour into a large bowl and add the mixture, beating until it is smooth and runny.
4. Pour the mixture into the tin and bake for 50 minutes to 1 hour, until the cake is golden and springy and a knife comes out clean when pushed in. Turn the cake out onto a wire rack.
5. Warm the remaining honey in a small pan. Using a skewer, make a number of holes in the cake. Brush the honey over the cake to give a sticky glaze, with some of it seeping in, then leave to cool.

Swiss Roll

3 eggs
75g caster sugar
75g self-raising flour
Jam
Caster sugar for dredging

Preparation

1. Weigh ingredients ensuring sugar and flour are kept separate.
2. Oven Gas mark 6/400F/200C/.
3. Grease and line a Swiss Roll tin 30cm by 20cm. Grease the paper.
4. Sieve the flour onto a plate and put to warm.

Method

1. Put eggs and sugar into a mixing bowl.
2. Stand the bowl over a pan of hot water. Note: if using an electric whisk this is not necessary.
3. Whisk the eggs and sugar until very thick and creamy white. The mixture should leave a trail when lifted.
4. Remove bowl from hot water and fold in the warmed flour with a metal spoon.
5. Pour the mixture into the prepared tin and allow it to run into the corners.
6. Bake for 8 -10 minutes in the centre of the oven. When cooked the cake will have risen and shrunk slightly, it should spring back when pressed with the finger tips.
7. Prepare a piece of greaseproof paper approximately 5cm larger than the Swiss Roll tin and sprinkle with caster sugar.
8. Turn the Swiss Roll out onto the sugared paper. Loosen the sides of the paper and carefully peel off.
9. Trim edges of cake with a sharp knife. Make a cut 5cm halfway through the cake and parallel with the end from which the cake will be rolled.
10. Soften and spread the jam evenly over the cake almost to cut edges.
11. To make a firm start to the roll, press half cut edge down and hold with one hand, then using the paper roll the cake up firmly. Hold the cake for a moment with the greaseproof paper still round it, to set the cake.
12. Remove paper, cool on a rack.

Gingerbread Person

| | |
|--------------------------------------|---------------------------|
| 225g S.R. flour | 3 tbsp milk |
| 100g margarine or butter | 1 level tsp mixed spice |
| 75g soft brown sugar (light or dark) | 2 level tsp ground ginger |
| Oven Gas mark 6/400F/200C | |

Best cooked middle to top of oven on a greased baking tray.

1. Sieve flour and spices together into a mixing bowl. Add the margarine or butter cut into small pieces.
2. Rub the margarine or butter into the flour to resemble fine breadcrumbs.
3. Add the sugar and stir into the rubbed-in mixture.
4. Gradually add the milk, mixing to a stiff dough. IT MAY NOT TAKE ALL THE MILK TO DO THIS.
5. Lightly dust the table with flour and knead the dough.
6. Roll out to approximately 5mm thick and cut out shapes. Gather up trimmings and re-roll until dough is used up.
7. Prick the tops lightly with a fork and you can brush with a little milk if you prefer.
8. Bake for 15 minutes (this will vary with the size of shapes) until they are golden brown. Test by gently pressing the biscuits – they should be firm to the touch.
9. Allow to cool and decorate in your own style.

Salt Dough Recipe

2 cups of plain flour
1 cup of table salt
1 cup of water

Put all ingredients into a mixing bowl and gradually add the water, mixing to a soft dough. Remove from the bowl and knead on a flat surface for 10 minutes (this helps to create a good smooth texture).

Cut out your shapes or create your model. Once your model is ready it will need 2 – 3 minutes in the microwave to harden it up. Put it onto a layer of greaseproof paper, on a plate.

You can also let the model 'air-dry' for a day or two or you can put it into a very low oven (Gas mark $\frac{1}{4}$ /225F/110C) until it is hard. The drying time needed will vary according to size and thickness. An average time for natural drying is 30-48 hours, whilst oven times are generally 3-4 hours.

When your model is dry, turn off the oven and leave inside the oven to cool down. You can paint salt dough with pretty much any paint, from acrylics to metallic sprays.

THE B.G.C. VEGETABLE TRAY COMPETITION

The B.G.C. Vegetable Tray class is for a collection of 3 types of vegetables taken from the following list of twelve. The quantity of each vegetable required for the collection is given in brackets:-

Each type of vegetable will be judged out of a total of 20 points. This is split into three sections as follows; 7 points for size, shape and colour; 7 points for condition; 6 points for uniformity. The overall mark will be out of a total of 60.

All vegetables are to be displayed for effect. The vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 450mm x 600mm, without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. A tray or board measuring 450mm x 600mm can be used to display the vegetables or the area can simply be marked on the staging. Where a tray has a lip or edge, it is the internal measurements that must not exceed 450mm x 600mm.

A black cloth is permitted, and the tray may be painted. Parsley is allowed for garnishing but no other foliage or accessories, such as plates, sand, rings and so on, will be allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia or string.

RULES FOR B.G.C. VEGETABLE TRAY COMPETITION - EXHIBITORS AND JUDGES

1. Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed back to 75mm.
2. Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached.
3. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces (the green flower bud case).
4. Judges may handle exhibits, open pods etc., to check for quality.
5. The tray, board or staging must not be cut or mutilated in any way at all, such as cutting holes for standing onions in.
6. Judges will use their discretion when judging the B.G.C. Vegetable Tray class, remembering that entries may come from fairly inexperienced exhibitors.
7. The points awarded should be clearly marked by the judges on the exhibitors' cards.
8. Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above Rules, should be referred to, and decided by the Show Officials.

Failure to abide by any of these rules will lead to disqualification.

GUIDANCE FOR EXHIBITORS

The Show Schedule should be studied very carefully, and all of the regulations noted, in particular closing dates for entries, staging times and lifting times. It is essential that these are observed.

Entry Forms should be completed legibly. Entries for pre-booking Classes should be sent before the closing date. Be sure to allow plenty of time to stage the number of entries you are submitting. It is very important to stage the number of specimens the Schedule calls for; failure to do so can result in your exhibits being 'not according to Schedule' and therefore out of contention for a prize.

Be sure, where possible, to take extra specimens of each cultivar with you to the Show; accidents do happen and replacements are better to hand than nestling at home.

Always remember that exhibiting is in the main pleasurable; be a sportsman at all times. Most Shows have a Complaints procedure; only use it after very careful and serious consideration. Exhibiting is supposed to be a pleasure, be sure by your conduct that everyone, including yourself, enjoys this pleasurable pastime.

Where a trophy is won every effort should be made to attend the presentation at the end of the day. By the same token, the return date should be observed.

RULES OF EXHIBITING

VEGETABLES:

As grown

The term 'as grown' means no foliage should be removed, just the soil washed away.

Dressed

Roots are removed and the top of the onion or shallot is bound with raffia and trimmed to a neat finish.

PRESERVES:

Avoid using 'trade' jars and tops, coffee jars are not suitable. Ensure the jar is clean, has a label that states the main ingredients and the date made. Trade names on lids should be covered. All exhibits will be tasted.

Jams and Marmalade

Jars should always be filled to the brim, the product should have a good colour and consistency. A wax circle is only used if a film/parchment top is used. The wax circle must be applied to the hot preserve. Twist tops should also be placed onto the hot product to ensure a good seal. Tops should not be changed for judging – checking the seal is part of the judging process. Jams and Marmalades should be displayed in 450g jars only.

Chutney

Chutney should be at least 2 – 3 months old before showing. The main ingredients used in the chutney should be listed on the label together with the date made. Mustard pickles are not a chutney and cannot be judged as part of a chutney class. Chutney should be displayed in 450g jars only.

Honey

Honey should be displayed in honey jars which should be filled to the top, no impurities should be visible in the honey. Jars do not need to be labelled.

BAKED GOODS:

Always read the Schedule carefully for the number required of a product and/or tin size. Finished products should not have cooling rack marks visible. All cooking papers should be removed before showing. The use of cling film or a mesh cover will help to maintain standards of hygiene.

Bread

Baked 24 hours before judging and usually presented on a bread board.

Victoria Sandwich

Evenly matched depth for each half. Sandwiched with raspberry jam. No additional filling e.g. cream. Light sprinkling of caster sugar on top is allowed. Delicate flavour.
